

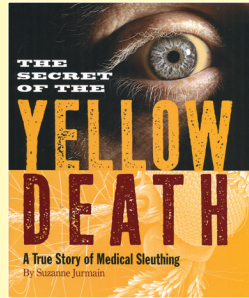

Teacher-directed Instruction is embedded in whole-class shared reading of a core text, with guided practice.

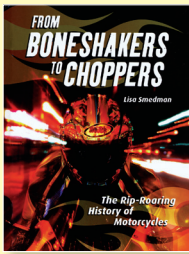
